

Web Browser-Assignment 1

1. Opening Multiple Web Browsers:
 - a. Open Lamarpa.edu website using the Chrome browser. Open cnn. com in another tab but in the same window. Use the Snipping Tool to take a screenshot. Use the RED pen in the Snipping Tool to circle the back and forward buttons, the refresh button, the address bar. Be sure your screen shot allows me to see that you have two tabs. Save the Screen Shot as **yourname lamarpa.edu website in Chrome**
 - b. Open Lamarpa.edu website using the IE browser and take a screenshot. Open amzon.com in another tab but in the same window. Use the **BLUE** pen in the Snipping Tool to circle the back and forward buttons, the refresh button, and the address bar. Be sure your screen shot allows me to see that you have two tabs. Save the Screen Shot as **yourname lamarpa.edu website in IE**
2. Testing passwords and logging in/out of Websites
 - a. When you log out of a website in one browser, are you logged out of the website in the another browser? To test it, do this: Open both IE and Chrome and login to YouTube.com in both browsers. In IE, logout of YouTube.com and then switch to Chrome. Try to do some things at YouTube in Chrome (such as go to the Video Manager). Are you still logged in to YouTube.com in Chrome?
 - b. If you login in one browser tab at a website, will you still be logged in another tab? To test it, do this: In Google Chrome open another tab and go to Google.com. Are you still logged in?

Submit the two screen shots and type the answers to the following questions (write your answers in the Write Submission area).

- a. If I am logged into Facebook on Chrome, and then I open IE and go to Facebook, will I be logged in to Facebook on IE?
- b. If I am logged into Facebook on Chrome, and then I open another tab in Chrome and go to Facebook, will I be logged into Facebook in the new tab?
- c. If I am using Chrome and I tell it to remember a password for a website i have visited, will the password be remembered by Internet Explorer, too?
